Her daily life is made of endless domestic chores despite her young age. Indeed, being the only girl, she must work a lot to cut down household chores, because in Haiti, more particularly in remote areas, domestic chores are still the business of only women and girls.

What makes this little girl special is not the fact that she works like a real adult at home, but rather the joy and the positive aura that emanate from her.

Michelove is particularly happy to be able to attend school despite the family's poor economic means. Her mother sells what comes from their small family garden in the streets.

She is very grateful for the opportunity that has been given to her, and she particularly likes writing exercises even though she must walk two hours back and forth to go to school.

Thank you to everyone who chose to sponsor a needy child at Paswadòm Divine Help School like this sweet little girl. Thanks to your generosity, she can enjoy jump rope with her classmates every school day.

The Least of These



These are some of the 70 students who attend the community school of Bourjolly, a locality in the Les Cayes region.

Despite their limited means, this community was able to set up a school to meet the educational needs of its children. However, they lack an essential component: drinking water. In fact, the nearest water point to the village school is more than an hour's walk away! The little ones need fresh water to be able to benefit from their school learning and activities.

Thanks to your generous donations to Water For Life's Well Drilling and Pump Installation Program, dozens of schools such as this one have already benefited from a water well.

But there is still a lot to do and many other schools, health

Meet Nayalie



Nayalie is only four years old, but she already suffers from numerous pathologies. We had met this poor child at our last mobile clinic which was held in Sainte Helene in the locality of Maniche.

She is the youngest of six siblings with a mother who is not even 30 years old.

In addition to suffering from partial ptosis of the eyelids, the girl has obvious signs of malnutrition (yellow and brittle hair, dark circles under the conjunctivae, tiredness, lack of energy and attention, and so on).

Thanks to your support to Water For Life Mobile Clinic Program, Nayalie was finally able to see several medical specialists including an ophthalmologist.

Unfortunately, the oculoplastic surgery she needs to preserve her vision is only available in Haiti through sporadic and uncertain medical missions. However, Nayalie was able to return home with the appropriate medication to combat the intestinal parasitosis that was draining her of her food supplies.

Thanks for your compassion toward her and the many other kids in need of health care.

Once that happens you can come and see firsthand people's thankfulness when they don't have to walk so far, even if they must pump it by hand to carry home for all their water needs—cooking, drinking, bathing and so on.

In contrast to them, for myself I think I need to have water coming into my house, under pressure, and even heated! And I waste water just because it's freely available, letting it run when I wouldn't have to. What a difference.

I am thankful that you are sensitive to people's needs and to what your brothers and sisters here experience every day.
