A Source of Love and Solidarity

In Haiti, despite the enormous dangers they face, in areas it's even possible many are still forced to dig wells by hand to gain access to water for daily use. Thus, from personal consumption to watering the garden, to bathing, to preparing meals, water is part of everyone's routine and is essential for life.

Hand digging a well is very dangerous due to the high potential for cave-ins and lack of oxygen. A hand-dug well is very difficult to protect from contamination. There are many ways for surface water to seep in, and the typical bucket on the rope used to fetch water from an open well easily transmits bacteria to the groundwater. Objects, people or animals may also fall into the well.



With each well that you help to drill in remote areas of Haiti, not only do you provide drinking water to more than 350 people, but you also save hundreds of people from consuming contaminated water and the occurrence of unfortunate accidents.

In this difficult context of the global pandemic of COVID-19, we ask our Almighty God that this situation of panic and mourning be transformed into a source of love and solidarity for one another. This same love and solidarity you have always shown to the Haitian people, some of you for over 35 years!

Thank you for staying true to these words of Jesus Christ: "Not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others." Philippians 2:4

The Love of Christ Personified!

In March, a happy team from Water For Life Haiti went to the Divine Help School of Pashwadòm to distribute shoe boxes to more than 500 children. The Calvary Chapel congregation from Quakertown, Pennsylvania, had filled hundreds of shoe boxes to the brim with love, compassion, sincerity, human warmth, peace, serenity, smiles...What a beautiful opportunity to really show the love of Christ to the most disadvantaged!
