Mobile Clinic

"When Jesus landed and saw the large crowd, he had compassion on them and healed their sick". (Matthew 14:14, NASV)

On May 8-9, because of your financial support and others' donated services, 511 people in a poor village located in Olivier, Petit Goâve, Southern Haiti, were able to receive quality medical care, free medicine, teaching on disease prevention and good health habits; above all the Gospel of Christ has been shared for soul salvation.

As we proceeded with seeing the patients we faced heart-breaking stories telling the suffering of this very quiet and sad little girl who has stunted growth due to malnutrition; her mother, being hearing-impaired, very poor and unable to meet her health needs.



Also a 15 years old boy who looks barely 7 who has retardation and epilepsy, with no access to basic healthcare. Lord, have mercy!



Glory to God for the love with which He loves us, making us capable of loving others. By the grace of God and your faithful generosity, numerous people with glaucoma have been diagnosed and referred to further care before they become blind. Our Haitian volunteer doctors and nurses saw a total of 40 people with cataracts, a common disease in Haiti that causes blindness. The ophthalmologist said cataracts can be treated by a simple surgery care that could last only 15 minutes with adequate equipment.

Dear friends, God is full of resources. Let us pray and stay open so He may use us to bless the poor.

You make a life-saving difference when you provide for the mobile clinics; this was the case for an 18



year old girl diagnosed with ectopic pregnancy (a life threatening condition) and referred to the nearest hospital.

The needs are overwhelming and your prayers and donations will bring hope and relief to poor

communities, save people's lives and educate in good health care habits.

Mona, her son and their new village well--

And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that always having all sufficiency in everything, you may have abundance for every good deed ;(2 Cor. 9:8, NASB)

Mona and her son live in the village of Olivier; they have a bright smile on their faces because of the precious gift of a donor who sponsored a well in her village.



Water being an everyday necessity, she often had to leave her young son in the care of neighbors while she went to fetch the precious and vital liquid, having no water source nearby. Her mind was not at peace when leaving her young son for so many long hours. The water she would come back with could cause her son to have waterborne diseases leading to expensive health care costs that would deplete her small budget. In addition to seeing her little boy bed-fast, she was losing income from not being able to go to work, hindering her productivity, making her escape from poverty even more difficult...

One generous donation has now changed her life, she will be able to enjoy more time with her son, watching him grow in strength and being playful, having access to clean and safe water that is essential to healthy living just a few steps away from her home.
