For the next few months at least we have postponed our mobile clinic due to increased presence of the Coronavirus, and school is off until September 6<sup>th</sup>. However, we keep drilling, and good clean water is really needed, not only for drinking but also for washing hands, as one important prevention to the coronavirus.

We have a long list of desperate communities in need of wells. Please keep praying for financial resources so we can bring together a ray of LIGHT to the despair of thousands of people.

We keep counting on the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ to open the spiritual eyes of the people in Haiti so again we can say together:

"WHERE DESPAIR ABOUNDS, FAITH, HOPE AND LOVE ABOUND MORE."
