Giving Access to Water...Again

Seventeen hand pumps! When announcing this figure to me, the manager of one of our two pump repair teams couldn't believe it himself.

The team of three technicians repairs pumps at an average frequency of three hand pumps per day, so 17 hand pumps in four days is a feat, especially when counting the long journey from one pump to another!

When they arrived in the rural area of the commune of L'Asile, they had seven pumps to repair. But, after each repair, other people showed up, sometimes from very far away, to ask for help because in their neighborhood, some pumps had been broken down for a long time.

"It is Jesus who sends you!" the population sometimes shouted, in areas where people were hesitant to give visitors a glass of water, so rare and precious it was.

The team worked very hard for a whole week to complete all their repairs, sometimes until 11:00 p.m. They put themselves at the service of the population and took their mission very seriously.



Some areas are so destitute that more than a thousand people use certain pumps daily, which wears out the mechanism and requires interventions all the faster.

Today we give glory to God for our two teams who repair around 650 pumps per year, allowing the poorest to continue to have access to water.

The needs are immense, and one of our two repair trucks is old and not in good shape anymore. We wish we could replace it to be more efficient on the field. It will only be possible with your help.

Thank you for your prayers for our two repair teams and for your donations which make their work possible.

Second Mobile Clinic Activity

At the end of July, we were able to implement our second mobile clinic of the year.

Glory to God for allowing workers to come forward for the

harvest! Indeed, we were able to assemble a team of volunteer doctors and nurses in all the areas we needed.



Water For Life staff, plus old and new volunteers, all worked together for two days to bless and help the Dory community.

Mobile clinics are often the only opportunity for people in a community to see a doctor throughout the year.

at home, and if she did, she risked severe hemorrhage with the possibility that neither she nor the child would survive. We convinced her to give birth in a health center for this pregnancy. Léonette is now the mother of a little girl; she was able to have a C-section in the hospital and both are doing well. Thank you, God, for this young woman, thank you for having allowed us to be the instrument that made it possible to save her life and the life she carried within her!

It is a constant encouragement to experience things like these, and we hope that Léonette's story has encouraged you too.

For the future mobile clinics, we will need to re-stock our materials and pharmacy. Your support for that is very welcome.
